A metaphor is a figure of speech in which a word or phrase that ordinarily designates one thing is used to designate another. That sounds a lot like a simile, but there's one key difference. What is the difference between a simile and a metaphor? Whereas a simile states that A is like B, a metaphor states that A is B or substitutes B for A.

A simile is an expression that uses the words like or as to describe something by comparing it with something else. A simile is like a metaphor except that a simile uses the words like or as to signal that a comparison is being made. "She's as fierce as a tiger" is a simile, but "She's a tiger when she's angry" is a metaphor.
