Writing the Outline Before beginning your outline, you want to have your preliminary research done—you can't write an outline until you know more or less what it is you are going to talk about. After you have researched your topic, you can then determine your thesis, or the main idea or point that you want to argue in your document.

Classic outlines denote the major sections of a work with upper case Roman numerals. Within each section, a subsection can be denoted with a capital letter, and smaller levels still with Arabic numerals, lower case letters, and, if really necessary, lower case Roman numerals.

When writing a topic outline, remember that it should just consist of words or phrases as it is just a quick overview of what you should write about.

Write down everything that happens in the novel, from the beginning to the end. Include details where you can, such as where the events take place, and who is involved. An alphanumeric outline is the most common, easily recognized outline type, and each subdivision is identified by Roman numerals, capitalized letters, Arabic numerals, and lowercase letters, in that order. Roman numerals (I, II, III, etc.) are used to mark each major heading or section.

How to Write an Outline? The most common college essay is 5 paragraphs. Thus, an easy way to remember the general format of a writing plan is to think of it as planning a 5 paragraph essayoutline where students would write an Introduction, Thesis, Body, and Conclusion. Then, fit a total of 5 paragraphs within the basic structure.

The standard order of an outline is: I. Roman numerals (I, II, III, IV, V, etc.) A. Capital letters (A, B, C, etc.) 1. Arabic numerals (1, 2, 3, etc.) a. Small letters (a, b, c, etc.) i. Small Roman numerals (i, ii, iii, iv, v, etc.)
